

USFS WORKS ON SALMON RIDGE TRAILS!

Wow! Besides the volunteer work on the Salmon Ridge trails, the USFS has done a substantial amount of work too! Here is a summary from Otis Allen, USFS Trails and Recreation below:

One day last week (Oct 4th -8th) Otis led a six person Whatcom county inmate crew for one day up Cougar to improve drainage on both sides of the bridge (funded by a RAC grant). They used a small bobcat machine with a backhoe attachment and made some headway. On the west side of Cougar Loop, they cleared a large turn around area, providing enough room for a truck and trailer or groomer to maneuver, at a site approximately 1/2 mile prior to the bridge access. They reported significant road damage to E. Cougar caused by vehicles that had tried to travel in the boggy area. They

apparently got stuck, creating large ruts that led water to run down the road/trail toward the swamp area. Unfortunately, in an attempt to repair the damage, the bobcat became stuck and was unable to complete any work east of the swamp area about 1/3 mile east of the bridge. The USFS plans to return to the area and create a large water bar and lead off ditch near the top of the problem area to block vehicles access to this problem area. The water bar will be substantial but will be created with snow groomer and skier access in mind and Otis will be on site to oversee the work.

Additionally, USFS engineers did road maintenance and logging on some of the roads this year and cleared culvert/ditch obstructions. They also hired a road maintenance contractor to work on road repairs on the White Salmon road portion of the Salmon Ridge ski trails on Oct. 15th.

Hurray for the USFS! Yippee!!
