

Brew Creek Lodge

Coordinated by Jerry and Susan McClung.

Jerry and Susan invite all club members to join us once more at the wonderful trails of the Callaghan Country and Whistler Olympic trails the first weekend in March Members will enjoy accommodations much closer to the trails than last year. We will be at the Brew Creek Lodge, only about 10 minutes from the ski trails.

Snow coach ride to Callaghan Country Backcountry Lodge is available for approximately \$18.50 CDN per person, We plan to charter a snow coach to take those who wish to ride instead of ski the 7.75 miles to the backcountry lodge in the pristine upper reaches of the valley.

Accommodations will be in the Guest House (maximum 8 people). 3 bedrooms plus 1 double sofa bed. the attached Executive Suite: (maximum 4 people) 1 double bed and 1 double sofa bed (no cots), and the attached North Suite: (maximum 2 people) 1 queen bed (no cot) Maximum # of people for the Guest House is 14. Accommodations cost will be about \$98CDN per night per person.

If we have more than 14 people, they will be in the main Brew Creek lodge, \$85.00 CDN for a standard room, 2 people per night.

There is a large hot tub just a few steps from the guesthouse, and from the main lodge. Think of it: ski all day, and soak in a hot tub just a few yards from the sound of the creek.

Trail Passes ~ Depending on the number of people, we can

buy a book of 10 or more tickets for each day. This means the passes will be \$16 each instead of \$20 each.

Meals ~ Catered.

Trails ~ Most of the Whistler Olympic recreational trails are open, and all of the Callaghan Country trails are open. Access to the trails this year is through the Callaghan Country, whose parking area is larger. There is a ski and snowshoe rental as well as snacks.

Bottom line: if we have our food catered, the total cost per person would be **about** \$255.00 for accommodations and most meals.



Report on The Logan Lake Trip

Kane Valley actually had more snow than Logan or Stake Lake this vear.






Dues are seasonal, with the 2009-2010 season starting in September.
