WRAC IS BACK !

The Winter Recreation Advisory Committee (WRAC) is coming to Blaine! Okay, so who the heck is WRAC and why should I WRAC is the funding care? committee for WA State Parks and Recreation's non-motorized Recreation Program. Winter They are the ones that decide who Sno-Park grant gets This year WRAC fundina. awarded over \$1.4 million in state grants. The money all comes solely from the purchase of the Sno-Park permits. Not one dime of tax payer money is

involved. This year, the NNSC was awarded \$4748 for a Sno-Park Grant plus another \$3000 Supplemental grant. That's quite an increase from the \$4522 we got last year.

The meeting will be at the Whatcom County School District Office, in Blaine, on Jan. 25th and you are welcome to attend. The last time they visited us was 14 years ago in 1999. A lot has changed at Salmon Ridge since then. Back then we were using snowmobile to groom а intermittently and we had Blueberry Bounce (the first part of the Cougar loop, up the first hill) but not the rest of the Cougar loop and there was no bridge. We didn't have an independent snowshoe trail then either and most importantly, there were no gates, so 4wheelers could drive on our trails whenever they wanted! So the idea is to showcase Salmon Ridge and show them how we've grown and improved. We hope to have NNSC members areeting WRAC out the members, showing them around and how important the Salmon Ridge Sno-Park is to this community. So grab your skis or snowshoes and come greet the WRAC members on Sunday, January 26th. Let them know how much we appreciate them for helping to fund the Salmon Ridge operations and how much our user base has grown.

CROSS COUNTRY SKIING LAKE WENATCHEE AREA SNO-PARKS THIS WINTER

In a nutshell - we're 100% ready. Barring any surprises, all trails will be groomed on a full schedule this year. We just need snow. Grant money from your SnoPark permit purchases has been awarded and we are fully funded again this year. Clean-up from last winter's storm is still underway in undeveloped areas of the park, but all ski trails are cleared. We have approval from the new owners of the Nason Ridge property to groom up there this winter (Thank you Weyerhaeuser / Columbia Timberlands!). Our partnership with Kahler Glen is improving every year - we anticipate continued improvements to the trails on their land

Over at the Chiwawa See & Ski the Forest Service trails crew did an excellent job in clearing the trail system of downed trees from the storm, and also pruned back the corridor throughout. We also accomplished some drainage work in that notorious wet area 1/2-mile in and will try out a new approach there which we hope will greatly reduce trouble there. A volunteer (Thanks Peter!) recommended a re-route which will allow us to avoid a couple too-tight turns and an alternative option during those times when much of the trail along the river has melted out. Peter and William the Groomer spent a few hours out there clearing the new path last week. We are exploring some extra trail mileage now possible with the completion of the forest thinning project too.

Our outstanding Snowshoe trail volunteers have been hard at it again in the North Park (kudos again to Lloyd and Cathy). Cut their way through dozens of storm-downed trees and will be signing and flagging the route before the snows come. They also have scouted out and signed the "Rock Ridge" snowshoe trail which they created a couple years ago over at the Chiwawa Sno-Park.

I am happy to report no changes to the Sno-Park permit program this year! Still a little complex, but it remains a successful selffunding program. Sno-Park passes are available:

New in 2014 The resort has changed ownership and the winter section of their website is not up to date. Troy, who is in charge of the winter ski area emailed me that there will be no change in trail prices (\$20 before 12:30, \$15 after; For 65+ it is \$12 before 12:30, \$9 after). He also wrote, "I am pleased to

tell you that we have purchased two new snowcats, which will give us a total of four. More than we have ever had before. The exciting thing about having these new snowcats is that we will be able to meet our commitment to having the best grooming possible.

Ski four days (stay three nights). Groomed trails, snowshoe trails, hot tub, sauna, steam room, swimming pool.

This is always a great trip. Chalet members plan the meals for their group and we share the cost of the food. We will have three dinners and three breakfasts. Bring your own food for lunch. Alcohol is not included in the food costs.


Carpooling is preferable. We can work together setting up carpools.

Stay in 1 chalet. The chalet has 2 double beds, 8 bunks, 3 baths, full central kitchen and dining/social area. Bedding and linens supplied with BASIC dishes and cutlery, a small microwave, a coffee pot and some cooking utensils. Washing dishes is our responsibility.

Cost is \$157 USD per person. Based on 10 adults and exchange rate at time of trip. LAKE WENATCHEE TRIP JANUARY 31 THRU FEBRUARY 3, 2014

This area offers seven different skiing locations within 16 miles of where we are staying. Accommodations are in Plain WA at Beaver Valley Lodge. Stay is for 3 nights and 4 days of skiing. The lodge may be seen at the <u>Beaver Valley Lodge</u> website.

The Wenatchee River bisects Lake Wenatchee State Park, thus creating the South Park and North park. The South Park has 18.6 miles and the North Park has 3.1 miles of groomed trails. Skate skiing is available in the North Park. South Park also offers tubing and a snow play area. There are 4.9 miles of snow shoeing trails. Another location is Nason Ridge that offers tracks and a skate lane. Additionally the trail leads to back country skiing for the more adventuresome. Total trail length is 17.9 miles of which 12 miles are groomed. Nearby is Chiwawa with the See and Ski trail groomed for track and skate skiing for 4 miles. Flying loop and Squirrel Run are 2.9 and 2.5 miles, respectively.

A Sno Park Permit is required and also a Special Groomed Trails Permit sticker. Drivers are responsible for the Sno Park Permit. Riders will share the cost of the Special Permit. Special permit stays with the driver after the trip is completed.

Meals will be planned and members will share the cost of the food. There will be three dinners and three breakfasts. Bring your own food for lunch.

Alcohol is not included in the food costs.

Cost is \$200 USD per person for lodging. Make checks payable to NNSC for \$200. Mail to 3310 Burch Mountain Road, Wenatchee, WA 98801.
