

We found it entertaining to watch the races, which ended at 1400. We then skied the race course. The time of day and snow conditions had us being cautious and we stopped skiing at 1600 because it was getting worse as the chopped up trail began to freeze and the late sunlight made it hard to see hazards. In spite of the poor ski conditions, we enjoyed each other's company as well as the accommodations of the Highland House. The 20% exchange rate didn't hurt either. It just goes to show that with a positive attitude a good time can be had even when conditions are not ideal.
