BUY YOUR SNO-PARK PERMIT!

Don't forget to buy a Sno-Park permit! You'll need one to park at the Salmon Ridge Sno-Park, or across the highway at the Anderson Creek or Silver Fir campground, between Nov 1st to April 30th. You can purchase them through our ski club NNSC, or at REI, Back-country Essentials, or at Cross-roads



Grocery in Maple Falls. Or purchase them on-line at: http://www.parks.wa.gov/winter/ nonmotorparks/permits/ .They are \$40 for a seasonal permit or \$20 for a one day permit, plus \$2 extra if you buy them through a retail store. It's really a good deal. At other commercial or club ski areas each person has to pay a trail fee each time they go. For the price of one Sno-Park permit, you can load up your vehicle with friends or family and go to over 47 Sno-Parks for the whole winter. It's really a good value for the monev.

By buying a Sno-Park permit, supporting vou are vour community trails and ski club. Sno-Park fees go into a dedicated fund which supports the WA State non-motorized Winter Recreation program. Proceeds are used to maintain and improve all the Sno-Park facilities throughout WA via Sno-Park grants. They pay for the Sno-Park, plowing out sanitation facilities, some of the trail grooming, signs, mapping, education, enforcement and program administration. This self program is totally sustaining. No tax payer money Don't get caught is used! without one; the fine is steep! Both the County Sheriff and the USFS do enforcement and education, so be sure to display your permit on your windshield.

When you go, we want your feedback. Please send your Nordic snowshoe ski and conditions reports to Pete Tryon at ski@tryonhayes.com so we can post them on the NNSC website to share with others. And if you see any trail obstructions. downed trees. etc... we need to know about these so we can go clear them from the trail. You can also give

feedback on the condition of a Sno-Park directly to the WA State Parks and Recreation Commission, on-line at: <u>http://www.parks.wa.gov/FormC</u> <u>enter/Winter-Recreation-</u> <u>9/SnoPark-Onsite-Evaluation-</u> Form-68.

KURT'S SECOND TRIP TO THE WHITE SALMON TRAIL

After finishing my morning paperwork I felt inspired to drive up to Razorhone Road to see if there was enough snow to ski. Two weeks before there wasn't any skiable snow, as the gates were still open to traffic but they had been closed for over a week. Baker down-hill ski area was showing plenty of snow, with it falling every day above 3500ft. Though the NNSC website didn't have any ski report, I had a gut feeling that it was snowing down at 2300' on Razorhone Road. I arrived at the Sno-park at about 1230 to a temperature of 32 degrees with snow falling and about 18 inches of sticky snow. There were at least eight vehicles in the parking lot though most people were snow-shoeing. There was a lot of new snow and it was light unfrozen and sticky. By 1330 it had cooled down enough that the snow wasn't sticking so badly. It was definitely skiable and I went as far as the washout beyond Cougar Loop. Coming back in my track I was able to actually ski instead of shuffle. It can be a workout but going back gliding up and down hill was what I'm looking for when I go out. Snow was piled on everything and the light was low.

Many times Razorhone Road can be a marginal ski but today was definitely a good ski day!

LAKE WENATCHEE

Jan 29 thru Jan 31, 2016

This area offers six different skiing locations within 16 miles of where we are staying. Accommodations are in Plain WA at Beaver Valley Lodge. Stay is for 3 nights and 4 days of skiing. The lodge may be seen at the <u>Beaver Valley Lodge</u> <u>website</u>.

The Wenatchee River bisects Lake Wenatchee State Park. thus creating the South Park and North park. The South Park has 18.6 miles and the North Park has 3.1 miles of groomed trails. Skate skiing is available in the North Park. South Park also offers tubing and a snow play area. There are 4.9 miles of snow shoeing trails. Nearby is Chiwawa with the See and Ski trail groomed for track and skate skiing for 4 miles. Flying loop and Squirrel Run are 2.9 and 2.5 miles, respectively. Nason Ridge is now open to XC skiing thanks to Weyerhaeuser, who purchased the land last year. Lower and Upper Nason Ridge offers approximately 4 miles and 8 miles of groomed trails, respectively. There is also backcountry trails in the area.

A Sno Park Permit is required and also a Special Groomed Trails Permit sticker. Drivers are responsible for the Sno Park Permit. Riders will share the cost of the Special Permit. The Special Permit will stay with the driver after the trip is completed.

Meals will be planned and members will share the cost of the food. There will be three dinners and three breakfasts. Bring your own food for lunch.

Alcohol is not included in the food costs.

NICKEL PLATE

Mar 11 thru Mar 14, 2016

Nickel Plate Nordic Centre is located in the Okanagan Valley, just 45 minutes from Penticton. It has approximately 34 miles of groomed trails for both classic and skate skiing. Additionally, there is 9 miles of marked snowshoe trails. Nickel Plate has one of the longest ski seasons in the western hemisphere, with trails for all abilities. Elevation is 6,000 feet.

Nickel Plate has a warm and cozy 4,000 square foot day lodge with kitchen, eating and lounge areas, and separate heated washrooms and shower facilities. Source: nickelplatenordic.org.

We will be staying in a house near Apex Ski Resort. It will be a 10 minute drive to the Nickel Plate Nordic Center. The house is called Mountain Time Chalet. It can be seen at www.airnb.com. You will have to enter Apex, BC as the area you wish to search, and then enter a date that the house is not booked for. Entering a middle of the week date is better than weekend dates.

Mountain Time Chalet is a family friendly, spacious 3 story cabin. It is located on White Tail Road, a quiet cul-de-sac close to the village (5 minute walk). It is a short walk down the street to the ski in/ski out trail. On the first floor enjoy the combined living dining area with cozy wood burning stove. The kitchen is fully equipped with a table that seats 8. The second floor includes a loft with games area, TV, DVD, VCR, stereo, foosball, and more. Also on the second floor are two bedrooms (each with a queen bed) and a loft sleeping nook with a double bed. The third floor is a bright 400 sq. ft. with one queen bed and two double beds, this floor also has a bath. Additional features include large boot room, deck, covered BBQ area, covered wood storage, fire pit, washer and dryer, and plenty of space. Source: www.airnb.com.
