## THE VALUE OF HELMETS

I was recently reminded of the value of my helmet, when going for our first ski of the season at Razor Hone. A large icy tree-avalanche whacked me on the head and shoulder. It hit hard enough to be quite painful -- I screamed! It knocked me flat onto my back. The main hit was directly on the top of my sturdy ski helmet.

I have been glad to have that helmet protection. I encourage you to join me in the helmet habit. My helmet makes me feel more secure; it may help your confidence to wear one. You might feel more at ease on a downhill. You will find it becomes quite comfortable. For me, skiing without a helmet just feels odd, like being in a car without a seatbelt. And you will set a nice example for others. My helmet habit first came from ice skating in Canada. In winter I go to the 'Silver Blades' adult skate sessions at the rinks, where folks wear helmets. One of the skaters said to me "consider that your head is the one part that doesn't heal well". That simple statement did it for me.

The helmets for ski and skate are not bicycle helmets, by the way. I measured my head and ordered online from Wildhorn. I've left the ear covers in place for warmth and added Giro goggles because of the better eye protection, but you might prefer to go lighter. Or maybe you want to add bright stickers, lights, and Bluetooth helmet-headphones!

So if you pass a couple on the trail wearing helmets, say "hello" to the O'Connor's.
